CHARLES KRUG VINEYARD: 1943
ACREAGE: 137
CLIMATIC ZONE: 3
SOIL STRUCTURE: *Predominantly Bale Clay Loam, Cole Silt and Pleasanton Loam*

Originally planted in 1861 to Mission grapes, this historic vineyard is currently planted with vines best suited to its gravelly, well-drained soils – Merlot, Zinfandel, Syrah, Petite Sirah and Petit Verdot – that originated from the Mayacamas foothills. Sauvignon Blanc thrives in the estate's clay loam soils deposited by the Napa River.

COLD SPRINGS VINEYARD: 2003
ACREAGE: 59
CLIMATIC ZONE: 3
SOIL STRUCTURE: *Aiken Clay Loam, Rhyolite*

The Cold Springs parcel comprises 23 acres planted to various clones of Cabernet Sauvignon. The site is characterized by a 1650 foot elevation, a south to southwesterly exposure and a gradual 100-foot elevation change. Cooler spring temperatures cause buds to break later than average, and warm summer nights produce fruit that demonstrates a great balance between acidity and sugar. Nutrient poor soil types stress the vines, producing intense wines from small clusters and berries. The altitude, and thin, rocky, and dry soil conditions create wines with firm structure, incredible varietal intensity and excellent aging properties.

YOUNTVILLE AVA



LINCOLN VINEYARD: 1966
ACREAGE: 70
CLIMATIC ZONE: 2
SOIL STRUCTURE: *Predominantly Bale Clay Loam*

Located within the Yountville Appellation and bordered by Rector and Conn Creeks, the Lincoln Vineyard is home to our oldest Cabernet Sauvignon vines as well as Cabernet Franc and Petit Verdot. The gravelly, sandy loam produces fruit that shows more red cherry, light herb and cassis berry aromas with firm, bold tannins.



VOLTZ VINEYARD: 1971
ACREAGE: 106
CLIMATIC ZONE: 2
SOIL STRUCTURE: *Bale/Cortina Loam and Clear Lake Clay*

A few miles southwest of Lincoln Vineyard at the base of the Mayacamas Mountains, Voltz is influenced by the eastern exposure with full morning sun, well drained soils and a slightly cooler marine environment. The Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc, Merlot and Petit Verdot grown in the three predominant soils types produces stunning concentrated black fruit with firm, elegant tannin structure.



SLINSEN VINEYARD: 1968
ACREAGE: 62
CLIMATIC ZONE: 2
SOIL STRUCTURE: *Predominantly Cortina Loam with Bale Clay Loam and Clear Lake Clay*

Contiguous with Voltz Vineyard, Slinsen shares a 0 to 5% slope with eastern exposure. Despite the close physical relationship, Slinsen displays a distinct core of red fruit and berry characteristics that complement the black fruit characteristics of wines from Voltz. These vineyards form the foundation of our Vintage Selection Cabernet Sauvignon, Family Reserve and Limited Release wines.



HOMEFINDER'S VINEYARD: 1969
ACREAGE: 30
CLIMATIC ZONE: 2
SOIL STRUCTURE: *Evenly divided between Clear Lake Clay and Cole Silt Loam*

The Napa River has influenced Homefinder's Vineyard through millennia of seasonal flooding and regular deposits of riverbed silt. Planted to five different Cabernet Sauvignon clones, some of this lush, vibrant fruit is also used in our Vintage Selection and Generations wines.



PAGE VINEYARD: 1974
ACREAGE: 75
CLIMATIC ZONE: 2
SOIL STRUCTURE: *Divided between Clear Lake Clay and Cole Silt Loam*

Rooted in the deep clay loam soils of the valley floor, Page can be dry-farmed in most years. The marine influence and ample California sun produce Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Petit Verdot, Petite Sirah and Malbec that provide us with complexity for varietal blends.

CARNEROS AVA



WILLOW LAKE VINEYARD: 1968
ACREAGE: 169
CLIMATIC ZONE: 1
SOIL STRUCTURE: *Cole Silt Loam and Bressa-Dibble (fine, well-drained soil)*

Exposed to cool ocean breezes and rolling fog off the San Pablo and San Francisco Bays, Willow Lake has a cool yet even climate – perfect for growing Chardonnay and Pinot Noir. The vineyard is tucked within rolling hills with various exposures and slopes and produces fruit with concentrated berry characteristics and supple, fruity aromas.
